SUQUAMISH MUSEUM TO PARTICIPATE IN BLUE STAR MUSEUMS

The Suquamish Museum is one of more than 2,000 museums across America to offer free admission to military personnel and their families this summer in collaboration with the National Endowment for the Arts, Blue Star Families, and the Department of Defense

[Suquamish, WA – May 26, 2016] – Today the Suquamish Museum announced the launch of Blue Star Museums, a collaboration among the National Endowment for the Arts, Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense, and more than 2,000 museums across America to offer free admission to the nation's active duty military personnel including National Guard and Reserve and their families from Memorial Day through Labor Day 2016. Leadership support for Blue Star Families programming and promotional materials has been provided by MetLife Foundation. The program also provides families an opportunity to enjoy the nation's cultural heritage and learn more about their new communities after a military move. "We are very proud to join the Blue Star Families organization in offering free admission to active duty military personnel and their families", said Suquamish Museum Director, Janet Smoak. "Naval Base Kitsap is very close to us and it is an honor to extend this open invitation to those stationed there," she continued.

About the Suquamish Museum

The Suquamish Museum opened in 1993 and is charged by the Suquamish Tribal Council to collect, preserve, study, exhibit and teach the living culture and history of the Suquamish Tribe and its Salish neighbors. The current facility, opened in 2012 in the heart of Suquamish Village, features the exhibit ***Ancient Shores ~ Changing Tides*** chronicling the Tribe's presence in the region since time immemorial. This summer, visitors will also see a temporary exhibit, ***SQ3Tsya'yay: 20 Years of Coast Salish Weaving*** by ***Sa'HLa mitSa***—Dr. Susan Pavel.
