Celebrate Archaeology Month at the Suquamish Museum!

SUQUAMISH, WA – September 29, 2014 The Suquamish Museum is celebrating Washington State designated Archaeology month with two programs.

Thursday, October 16, 5:15 pm to 6:30 pm - Movie Nite featuring *The Archaeology of West Point* produced by Gabe Kean Design. The documentary presents the story of a land and its people and how both changed over time. It's a tale of urban archaeology and discovery of ancient cultures beneath the City of Seattle, cultures and traditions that endure today. The earliest deposits date back over 4,000 year ago. The West Point Teaching Kit will also be on display to explore in depth about this important Coast Salish archaeological site.

Saturday, October 18, 3:30pm to 5:00 pm – Presentation by Dennis Lewarch, Suquamish Tribal Historic Preservation Officer. Mr. Lewarch will share information, photographs and graphics about the archaeological investigations that have occurred at the Old Man House Village site on Agate Passage beginning in the 1950s.

The archaeological themed exhibit, *45-KP-2: The Archaeology of Old Man House*, closes Sunday, October 19. Followed by *Salish Bounty: Traditional Native Foods of Puget Sound*, opening Saturday, October 25.

The Suquamish Museum is open year round. Currently, Winter hours begin October 1 through April 30, Wednesday through Sunday, 10 am to 5 pm and by appointment on Monday and Tuesday.
